Prior to the conference a rheology course on emulsions and food colloids will be given after lunch on Wednesday June 13th by professor Crispulo Gallegos from University of Huelva, Spain.

The focus for NRC2012 is "Rheology for industrial processes", and the main theme is "Rheology of food and emulsions". The conference, as

usual, covers all aspects and areas of rheology. All kinds of papers are welcome, especially e.g. industrial case studies. The aim is a large gathering of people interested in the scientific, technical, and applicational development within this field.
